

USING ZOOM MADE EASY

Zoom is an easy to use online meeting platform, that can help you stay connected with each other. You can hold your Board Meetings with Zoom, meet in small groups or as a whole Club.

For many this will be a step out of the comfort zone into the world of online meeting, but it need not be too challenging. There is so much information available, and below are a few links to help you on that journey.

Best practice would say that it best not to advertise your meeting links on social media but rather email or message them to those you want to join in. This is just to protect your members privacy.

Some important steps to follow before your try to connect online with others

- Check your computer settings to make sure that you have your microphone, and audio activated
- Check whether you have a web cam on your computer or desktop. You will still be able to join in a meeting without one but you will not be visible to others in the group.
- Once you have downloaded the Zoom app, login with your email and create a password. If you don't do that, you will have to enter the meeting ID and password before being able to join in a meeting.
- At the commencement of joining a meeting, ensure that you have ticked the boxes that indicate you want to use your device's audio system and video.

There is so much online assistance available to help you get started, plus many webinars and online demonstrations being offered by Rotary Groups already using it, or others who are happy to help you get started.

You can use Zoom on your phone, tablet, laptop or desktop computer. You may want to download and activate Zoom on a number of your devices so that can easily connect wherever you are.

Can I Use Bluetooth Headset?

Do I have to have a webcam to join on Zoom?

While you are not required to have a webcam to join a Zoom Meeting or Webinar, you will not be able to transmit video of yourself. You will continue to be able to listen and speak during the meeting, share your screen, and view the webcam video of other participants.
